- IX. An adventurous (optimistic) believer. An ideal church member is one who is moved by their faith in God. He will expect "great things from God and undertake great things for God."
- **X. A tither.** An ideal church member will cheerfully give their tithes and offerings to support the cause of Christ.
- XI. A spirit filled witness. An ideal church member is filled with Holy Spirit. Read Ephesians 5:18

XII. An ardent soul-winner.

- A. The mark of an ideal church member is an earnest desire to be a soul-winner.
- B. A soul-winner may never bear his testimony publicly, and people may know little of his efforts, but in private, personal contact, he seeks to lead those about him to Christ.
